
Moreover, the Foundation's flagship project, the Emmanuel Orji Skills Solution Center, will be presented to our guests and sponsors as part of the

# Mission & Vision



## MISSION

The Herbert Onye Orji Foundation's journey began with a fervent desire to address the pressing issues hindering the growth and prosperity of Nigerian communities. Recognizing the widening gap in education accessibility, the stifled opportunities for skill development, and the lack of support for entrepreneurial endeavors, the foundation emerged as a force dedicated to bridging these gaps.

The foundation has evolved into a driving force for positive transformations. Through commitment and dedication, the foundation has executed several initiatives towards its mission. The mission of the foundation is to:

- Support university graduates and micro or small business owners with building skill sets that advance their socioeconomic status
- Educate, empower, and train students, graduates, and young adults who are financially challenged but possess talent, ingenuity, and ambition.
- Establish access to career and business opportunities in finance, technology, and entrepreneurship.

Educational scholarships have opened doors that were once closed, offering deserving youths the chance to pursue their dreams. Skill-building programs equipped the youth with tools beyond textbooks, empowering them to carve their paths to success. Grants offered to aspiring entrepreneurs used to start micro or small businesses. Community healthcare initiatives that bring vital care to the doorsteps of underserved populations, fostering healthier futures. These are

some of the programs that we foster and work towards annually.

## VISION

The heartbeat of the Herbert Onye Orji Foundation lies in its impact—seen in the transformed lives and thriving communities across the eastern region of Nigeria. Stories of resilience, determination, and triumph abound, as youths empowered by the foundation's programs emerge as leaders and change-makers within their spheres.

But our story is far from complete. The journey continues guided by our determination to encourage the communities we foster, where underprivileged youths and young professionals are championed, where opportunities are accessible, and where collective progress knows no bounds.



# About the Founder



Established in 2012, the Herbert Onye Orji Foundation passionately pursues Prof. Herbert Onye Orji's vision to support and develop the potential of young adults seeking academic and career trajectory and success. The goal is to withstand socio-economic challenges in Nigerian communities with unwavering faith in education, mentorship, and entrepreneurship.

Prof. Herbert Orji (FCIB – London, CFA, OON) has a very strong and accomplished history of working in finance: wealth management and investment banking. He was skilled in investor relations, operations management, asset management, retail and commercial banking. He had degrees from Howard University (BA, Mathematics and Economics), Eastern Michigan University (MBA, Finance & Operations Research), Union Institute & University (PhD), and Harvard University (PMD).

His professional career began at American Express Company on Wall Street in New York where he was promoted to Vice President to lead a division of the company. This position made him the first African to become Vice President of a US based multinational financial corporation. Thereafter, he moved to Nigeria with his family to obtain the position of Pioneer Representative & General Manager of United Bank for Africa (UBA) in the U.K. Prof. Herbert Orji later became the Managing Director & CEO of Progress Bank of Nigeria from 1985-1991. His accomplishments, during his tenure at Progress Bank, led the Board of Governors of the Chartered Institutes of Bankers of Nigeria to elect him a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Bankers in 1988.

In 1993 he joined Summa Guaranty & Trust Company, an investment banking and asset management firm. He first came in as an advisor to the board and two years later he became the

Chairman and CEO, while still teaching as a part time Senior Faculty Member of the Lagos Business School (now Pan-African University). In 2005, he was voted The Most Distinguished Stockbroker of the Year award in Nigeria at the South African Annual Conference of Investment Bankers and Managers. This was the first of such awards for Nigeria. Over the years he has won over 20 professional, civic, and academic awards.

Before the foundation was formed, Prof. Herbert Orji was effortlessly and happily sharing his time, knowledge, and worldly experience with people he encountered that needed or wanted academic and career mentorship. He was involved with other non-profits such as the Healthcare Organization for Africa, which provided medicine, general treatment, and medical supplies to rural areas in Abia, Imo, Anambra, Enugu, Ebonyi, Akwa Ibom, and Cross River. He was an avid donor and contributor to organizations and churches such as United Way Worldwide – Nigeria, American Cancer Society, Church of the Assumption, Ikoyi, Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, D.C., and Saint John's Catholic Church, Item, Abia.

Prof. Herbert Onye Orji was appointed to various positions at International Finance Corporation, Business In Africa Group Limited, and ADIC Properties Limited. He served on the board of different organizations such as the Guardians of the Nation International, Nigerian Stock Exchange, United Way Worldwide, and Harvard Business School Association of Nigeria where he was President as part of the Executive Board of Directors.

He passed away on January 17th, 2019. He is survived by his wife and seven children.

# Executive Management



**Dr. (Mrs.) Nnenna A. Orji**, JD, LLM is the CEO and Co-founder of the Herbert Onye Orji Foundation (HOOF). In this role and alongside the organization's Board of Trustees, she guides the organization – and their team members and volunteers – toward a vision to educate, empower, and establish entrepreneurial opportunities for young adults and small business owners. Mrs. Orji oversees the creation of effective strategic planning processes and fulfills a mission-critical role that is vital to funding all mission delivery work.

Mrs. Orji, an economist, lawyer and jurist, was the Executive Chairman of the Investments and Securities Tribunal, Nigeria (IST). She joined the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) Nigeria in 1984 as pioneer head of the legal division, and later became the Head of Enforcement Unit at SEC. Under her leadership, the Legal & Enforcement Department transformed the Securities and Exchange Commission into a world class knowledge based regulatory agency.

Mrs. Orji holds a B.A (Hons.) in Economics & Business Administration from Howard University, Washington, DC; Doctor of Jurisprudence (J.D) from Howard University, School of Law, and LLM Degree with emphasis on corporate and commercial law from New York University (NYU), School of Law, New York. She was called to the Nigerian Bar in 1982.



**Vivianne Orji** is the Director of Communications and Operations. She is a senior strategic adviser to the organization's executive and volunteer leadership teams on reputation, communications issues, and risk-related matters. In her role, she assists with the strategic development and support of the organization's community and network fundraising programs, corporate support and operations, and volunteerism.

As the organization's senior-most staff executive, Vivianne is responsible for driving the development and implementation of HOOF's income and mission strategies across the eastern states of Nigeria. She also works to engage corporate executives, community partners, high-level donors, and leadership volunteers in furthering the fight against socioeconomic barriers that stifle the progress of small business entrepreneurs and young adults seeking jobs.

Vivianne Orji holds a B.A in Journalism from Howard University, Washington, DC and a Master of Business Administration (MBA), University of Bradford, West Yorkshire, England.

# EMMANUEL ORJI SKILLS SOLUTION CENTER



The Emmanuel Orji Skills Solution Center is a new project under development by the Herbert Onye Orji Foundation (HOOF). It will be built as a business and technology center where students and young adults or professionals can come to learn different skill sets as a form of capacity building to enhance their abilities and knowledge in finance, engineering, and technology. The center is a huge milestone we plan to construct and accomplish as part of the mission for HOOF, which is to provide a skills acquisition space in the eastern region of Nigeria. The center will be based in Aba, Abia. Aba is a major commercial city in Abia state and is known for its vibrant markets, thriving businesses, and enterprising residents. Residents of the city are renowned for their enterprising spirit and commercial endeavors, making the city one of Nigeria's foremost commercial hubs.

The Emmanuel Orji Skills Solution Center will expand access to essential courses and capacity building training in the areas of finance, business management, engineering, computer science, and information systems. The center will serve as a destination for comprehensive programs, modules, and research to assist in the process of developing and strengthening the skills, knowledge, resources, and abilities of individuals and communities. The goal is to train them in new technologies and teach technical and professional skills to prepare for a chance at a rewarding career. The apprenticeship program will ensure that individuals across the eastern region will receive education and training without the need to travel far from their community.

The center also aims to create opportunities for self-employment as a journeyman (welder, plumber, electrician, lineman, and machinist). Acquiring skills is crucial for professional growth and career relevance, so our plan is to facilitate our entrepreneurs' competitiveness. Therefore, as part of our ongoing commitment to lift ambitious and aspirational individuals out of economic hardship, the foundation has embarked on the construction of its flagship project, the Emmanuel Orji Skills Solution Center.
